Principal Activities

The Company's principal activities are the design, development and sale of systems and applications management computer software to provide precise performance management solutions for high-reliability computer systems.

The Company continues to increase its investments in and revenue from Prognosis-based consulting services during the half-year and expects to increase this in future periods.

Half-Year Results

The Company achieved first half profit after tax of \$2.4 million compared to the equivalent prior period of \$2.7 million. Revenue for the first half was \$20.5 million representing an 11% increase over the prior period.

The Company continues to benefit from its investment in research and development activities and the associated tax benefits. These tax benefits assisted the Company to achieve an overall income tax rate of 16%.

For the financial year ended 30 June 2010, as detailed in the Directors' Report for that financial year, a final dividend of 1.0 cents per share franked at 45% was paid to the holders of fully paid ordinary shares in September 2010.

Review of Operations

Revenue

The Company experienced licence sales growth for both its HP NonStop and IP Telephony (IPT) product lines. In local currency, the US achieved overall revenue growth of 29% and Europe 40% (refer segmental note in accounts). Asia Pacific experienced a 2% decline in revenue. Revenue from consulting services was \$1.3 million, representing an increase of 93% over the equivalent prior period.

Expenses

Total expenses were \$16.8 million, up 11% against the six months to December 2009. The Company has significantly increased its investment in consulting services with a 60% increase in solution consultant personnel. Overall staff numbers at 31 December 2010 were 164 compared to 157 at 31 December 2009.

Statement of Financial Position

The company continues to maintain a strong financial position and remains debt free with \$8.7 million cash at bank as at 31 December 2010. Cash flows from operating activities improved by 59% over the equivalent prior period to \$5.7 million.

Outlook

The Company anticipates continuing growth in underlying operational performance but reported financial performance will be influenced by fluctuations in currency exchange rates.

Interim Dividends

Directors have declared an interim dividend of 1.5 cents per share franked to 50% per share, payable on 11 March 2011 to shareholders registered at the end of trading on 25 February 2011.

Notes to the condensed consolidated financial statements

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

a) Statement of Compliance

The half-year financial report is a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 and AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting. The half-year report does not include notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report and shall be read in conjunction with the most recent annual financial report.

b) Basis of Preparation

The condensed financial report is presented in Australian dollars and is prepared on the historical cost basis, with the exception of cash flow hedges, which are at fair value. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars unless otherwise stated.

The Company is of a kind referred to in ASIC Class Order (CO) 98/100 dated 10 July 1998 and in accordance with that Class Order, amounts in the financial report and Directors' Report and the half year financial report have been rounded off to the nearest thousand dollars, unless otherwise indicated.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half-year financial report are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the company's 2010 annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2010. These accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards and with International Financial Reporting Standards.

Note 2. Segment information

The information reported to the CODM (being the Chief Executive Officer) for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of performance is focused on geographical performance. The principal geographical regions are The Americas - Operating from the United States with responsibility for the countries in North, Central and South America, Europe - operating from the United Kingdom with responsibility for the countries in Europe, Asia Pacific - operating from Australia with responsibility for the countries in the rest of the world and Corporate Australia - includes revenue and expenses for corporate head office and development functions of the company.

Inter-segment pricing is determined on an arm's length basis.

Segment profit represents the profit earned by each segment without allocation of central administration costs and Directors' salaries, investment revenue and finance costs and income tax expense. This is the measure reported to the chief operating decision maker for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance.

Information regarding these segments is presented below. The accounting policies of the reportable segments are the same as the Group's accounting policies.
