Explanation of Revenue and Profit (continued)

Total revenue declined by 18.6%, compared to the previous corresponding half year, driven by a decline in the number of signed sales contracts during the half (2010: US\$3.82m; 2009:US\$5.55m). Additionally, the stronger Australian dollar relative to the US dollar has decreased the amount of recognised revenue derived from both sales contracts in place at 1 July 2010 as well as those signed throughout the half year.

Measured in Australian dollars, CogState recorded a 22% decrease in sales to customers compared to the previous corresponding half year. However, on a constant currency basis, the decrease in revenue was 14%, as shown below:

Earnings before interest expense, grant income, tax, foreign exchange gain/loss and termination fees decreased 120% from the previous corresponding period, primarily due to the decrease in sales revenue.

Direct costs of conducting trials increased 9.6% from the previous corresponding period (2010: \$1.92m; 2009: \$1.76m). The increase in direct costs can be attributed to an increase in direct employee numbers; direct employees totalled 18 at 1 July 2009 and have increased steadily to 24 by 31 December 2010. CogState does have a North American office and therefore a portion of direct costs are US dollar denominated, allowing CogState to benefit from a reduction in those costs when measured in Australian dollars. However given that the majority of CogState costs are incurred in Australia, the lower US dollar has not significantly reduced direct costs.

Other indirect operating costs are consistent with the previous corresponding period (2010:\$2.44m;2009: \$2.45m).

Employment costs of \$2.67m (2009: \$2.45m) accounted for 63.5% of operating expenditure (total direct trial costs and indirect operating costs, 2009:58.2 %).

The Net Loss After Tax for the period was \$0.90m, a decline of \$1.43m on the previous corresponding period (2009: \$0.53m profit). The decline in NPAT can be attributed to the reduction in sales, share of joint venture loss (\$0.38m), and an increase in foreign exchange losses (\$0.16m). These three factors combined to reduce profit by \$1.37m compared to the previous corresponding period.

Foreign exchange losses for the half year ended 31 December 2010 totalled \$0.30m (2009: losses of \$0.14m).

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DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your directors submit their report for the half year ended 31 December 2010.

This half year report covers the consolidated entity comprising CogState Limited and its subsidiary, CogState Inc. and its subsidiary CogState Sport Inc. (the Group).

REVIEW AND RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

CogState's primary market is cognitive testing in clinical trials. In this market, CogState's technology and associated services are used to quantify the effect of disease and of drugs, devices or other interventions on human subjects participating in clinical trials conducted by pharmaceutical, biotechnology, nutraceutical and functional food companies.

CogState conducts its operations from offices in Australia, the USA and the UK.

Revenue from the provision of cognitive testing services for the half year ended 31 December 2010 (\$3.95m) decreased 22.5% compared to the half year ended 31 December 2009 (\$5.10m). However, on a constant currency basis, the decrease in revenue was 14%, as shown below:

The Net Loss After tax for the period was \$0.90m, a decline of \$1.43m on the previous corresponding period (2009: \$0.53m profit). The loss before income tax was \$0.97m, a decline of \$1.52m on the previous corresponding period (2009: \$0.55m profit).

The decline in performance resulted from a decline in the number of new contracts signed in the current period, in addition to a stronger Australian dollar relative to the US dollar. In the current period, USD\$3.82m of contracts were signed as compared to the previous period where USD\$5.55m were signed. Foreign exchange losses for the period were \$0.30m compared to losses of \$0.14m for the corresponding period last year. These losses arose mainly on the Group's \$US-denominated trade debtors and \$US bank accounts and included both realised and unrealised losses.

Non-operating contract termination fees of \$0.09m were paid in respect of the termination of a sales and marketing agreement. The contract termination fees represent revenue sharing on a small number of sales contracts that would have been payable by CogState under the sales and marketing agreement.

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DIRECTORS' REPORT (continued)

Other operating costs (excluding, termination costs, foreign exchange movements, interest expense and gain on sale of assets) are consistent with the previous corresponding period (2010: \$2.44m; 2009: \$2.45m).

Employment costs of \$2.67m (2009: \$2.45m) accounted for 63.5% of total direct trial costs and operating costs (2009:58.2%).

Full time equivalent employees at 31 December 2010 totalled 40 (inclusive of the 24 direct employees), compared to 30 full time equivalent employees at 31 December 2009.

NOTES TO THE HALF YEAR FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation

This general purpose condensed financial report for the half year ended 31 December 2010 has been prepared in accordance with AASB134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The half-year financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the consolidated entity as the full financial report.

It is recommended that the half-year financial report be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2010 and considered together with any public announcements made by CogState Limited and its controlled entity during the half-year ended 31 December 2010 in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations of the ASX listing rules.

Apart from the changes in accounting policies noted below, the accounting policies and methods of computation are the same as those adopted in the most recent annual financial report.

(b) Changes in accounting policy

All accounting policies applied in this half-year financial report are the same as those used in the annual financial report for the year ended 30 June 2010.

The Group has not elected to early adopt any new Standards or amendments that are issued but not yet effective.

2. OPERATING SEGMENTS

Identification of reportable segments

The Group has identified its operating segments based on the internal reports that are reviewed and used by the executive management team (deemed the chief operating decision maker) in assessing performance and in determining the allocation of resources.

The operating segments are identified by management based on the nature of the services provided (i.e. cognitive testing). Discrete financial information is reported to the executive management team on at least a monthly basis.

Types of products and services

The types of products and services sold in this half-year are the same as those disclosed in the annual financial report for the year ended 30 June 2010.

Accounting policies and inter-segment transactions

The accounting policies used by the Group in reporting segments internally are the same as those contained in note 1 to the accounts and in the prior period.

It is the Group's policy that if items of revenue and expense are not allocated to operating segments then any associated assets and liabilities are also not allocated to segments. This is to avoid asymmetrical allocations within segments which management believe would be inconsistent.

The following items not allocated to operating segments as they are not considered part of the core operations of any segment:

- Interest revenue
- Fair value gain on derivative
- Interest expense
- Non-operating termination fees
- Foreign exchange gain/loss
- Profit/loss on disposal of assets

Impairment of intangible assets

The current half year loss is an impairment indicator. Therefore we have assessed the impact based on value in use calculations. These calculations use cash flow projections based on actual operating results and the three year business plan. A terminal value is then calculated based on the growth rate to extrapolate cash flows beyond the three year forecast period. Projected cash flows, including the terminal value, are discounted using the applicable market discount rate.

We have determined no impairment has been incurred to 31 December 2010.

We conducted our review in accordance with the Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410 Review of a Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the financial report is not in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 including: giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December2010 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001. As the auditor of CogState Limited and the entities it controlled during the half-year, ASRE 2410 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.

A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our review, we have complied with the independence requirements of the *Corporations Act* 2001. We have given to the directors of the company a written Auditor's Independence Declaration, a copy of which is included in the Directors' Report.



Conclusion

Based on our review, which is not an audit, we have not become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report of CogState Limited is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*, including:

- a) giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2010 and of its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and
- b) complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001.
