MAp announces traffic performance at its airports for May 2011.

MAp CEO, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "MAp's airports delivered an excellent set of traffic results in May 2011, with strong growth across nearly all passenger segments. Sydney achieved 7.8% international growth, driven by Australian outbound and emerging inbound markets. Copenhagen grew 7.1%, boosted by new routes and services, particularly to long-haul destinations. Brussels delivered 8.4% growth, and particularly pleasing intra-EU traffic growth of 11.9%, driven by Star Alliance Carriers.

"Sydney recorded another month of solid growth during May. International traffic increased significantly on the pcp as a result of continued growth in the Australian outbound and Asian inbound markets including China, Malaysia and Thailand. During the month, Sydney welcomed the introduction of additional wide-body services to Perth by Qantas and Virgin Australia, which will boost domestic capacity into and out of Sydney. Qantas commenced the first non-stop service to Dallas/Fort Worth, meaning Sydney now serves five direct North American destinations. The announcement of the long term partnership agreement between Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines is also an exciting development for passengers and the airport.

"Copenhagen delivered strong growth, with traffic 7.1% above the pcp. It was the first May during which over two million passengers travelled through the airport. International O&D continues to be the main driver of traffic growth, reflecting the successful launch of new intercontinental and European routes in 2010 and 2011. Thai Airways announced a new intercontinental route to Phuket starting in November 2011, the airline's first direct service between Europe and Phuket.

"Brussels reported traffic growth of 8.4% above the pcp. The airport recorded strong performances across most segments with growth underpinned by intra-EU traffic, reflecting the capacity increases during 2010 and 2011. Despite strong double digit traffic growth on many long haul routes, the extra-EU segment continued to be affected by political unrest in the Middle East and North Africa. The growth in transfer traffic is very pleasing as Brussels Airport continues to develop as one of the Star Alliance's European hubs."

Sydney Airport

Key Points:

- Total passenger traffic for May is estimated to have increased 4.2% on the pcp, with domestic traffic estimated to be up 3.0% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic on-carriage) up 7.8% on the pcp.
- Australia was the major market that grew (+15%), together with China (+13%) and New Zealand (+4%). Korea (-13%), France (-12%), Japan (-8%), the USA (-6%), and Germany (-5%) were the major markets that declined.
- Virgin Australia's first A330 service to Perth commenced on 26 May 2011. From July, Virgin Australia will operate three daily A330 services to Perth. Qantas commenced the first of its six weekly B747 services to Perth on 30 May 2011.
- Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines have signed an agreement to establish a long-term partnership. Under the agreement, the airlines propose to codeshare on flights; offer reciprocal frequent flyer programme benefits and lounge access; co-ordinate flight schedules; and engage in joint sales, marketing and distribution activities.
- Qantas will increase the number of seats on nine B747 and 12 A380 aircraft, with work to commence in August 2011. The changes will add 57 seats to B747 aircraft and 34 seats to A380 aircraft.
- Qantas and American Airlines have been given interim approval for their proposed trans-Pacific joint business agreement, allowing them to undertake joint sales and marketing campaigns.

Copenhagen Airport

Key Points:

- May 2011 traffic was 7.1% higher than the pcp, with a monthly record of over two million passengers travelling through the airport.
- Domestic O&D traffic was 2.6% above the pcp, as the positive effect of the domestic routes that were launched a year ago have now been cycled.
- International O&D traffic was 11.2% above the pcp. Underlying growth continues to be driven by new intercontinental and European routes launched in 2010 and 2011. Traffic to the Middle East has started to recover, following recent declines that were caused by unrest in the region.
- Transfer traffic was 2.4% below the pcp. Transfer traffic continues to be influenced by new direct competing routes from Swedish airports and a reduction in services to Barcelona.
- Thai Airways announced that it will launch a new route between Copenhagen and Phuket between 4 November 2011 and the end of March, operating three weekly frequencies.

Brussels Airport

Key Points:

- May 2011 traffic was 8.4% higher than the pcp, with over 1.7 million passengers travelling through the airport.
- Intra-EU traffic was 11.9% above the pcp. Brussels Airlines continued to report strong growth due to increased capacity through partial replacement of its short haul fleet with larger aircraft, and increased load factors. Intra-EU traffic also benefited from double digit growth of other Star Alliance carriers, and within the low cost segment.
- Extra-EU traffic was 2.3% above the pcp. Solid underlying growth in the long haul segment continued to be driven by new services introduced in 2010 and further capacity increases during this year, including the new Qatar Airways service to Doha. However, traffic to the Middle East and North Africa continues to be impacted by a low number of bookings due to ongoing political unrest in the region.
- Strong transfer and transit traffic growth of 42.0% was due to a continuing higher proportion of transfer traffic in both the long haul and short haul segments.
- Brussels Airlines will launch a new route to Bamako via Accra from September 2011 operating a twice weekly service. It will also increase the number of weekly frequencies to Moscow from 8 to 10 during the winter season, and reinstate the third weekly service to Abidjan from September. CSA Czech Airlines will launch a new route to Bratislava from the end of June 2011, operating three weekly frequencies. Turkish Airlines will increase the number of weekly services on the Istanbul route from 21 to 24 from July 2011.
