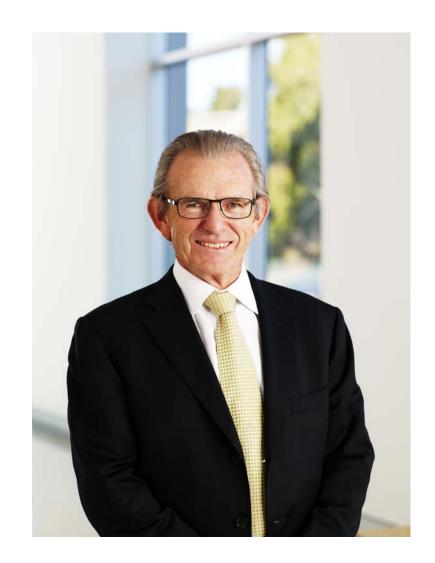

Strategic framework for growth

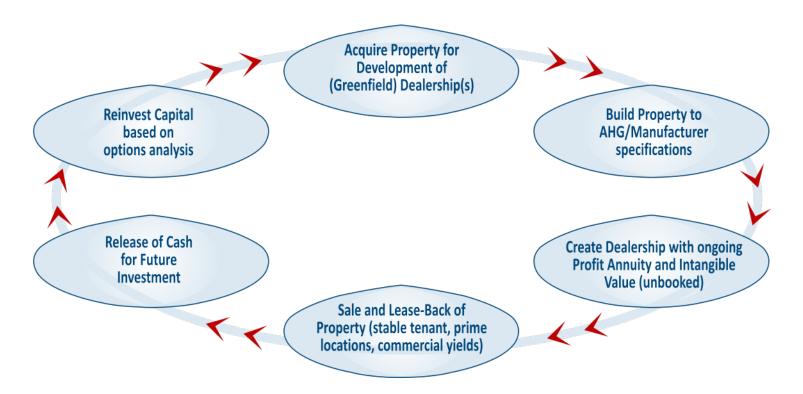


- Utilising the Group's size, experience and financial strength to drive future growth

- Generate organic operations growth through establishment of dealerships without paying goodwill



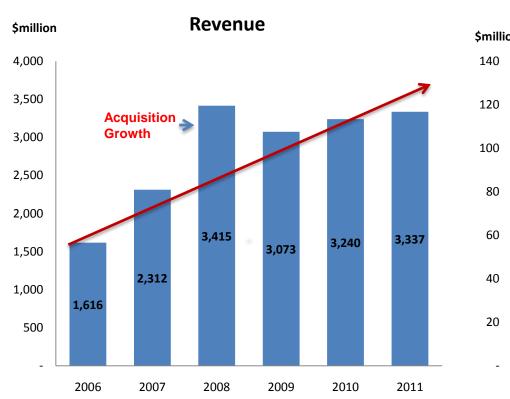


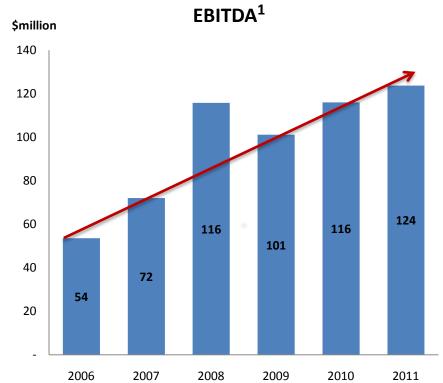

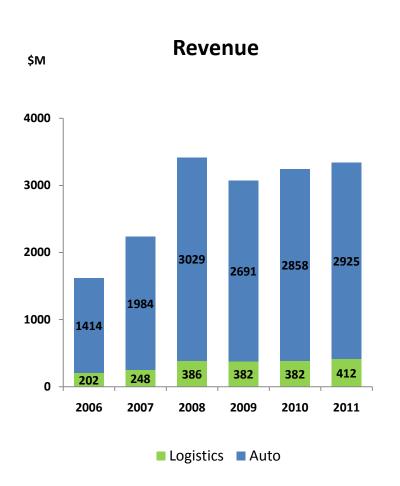

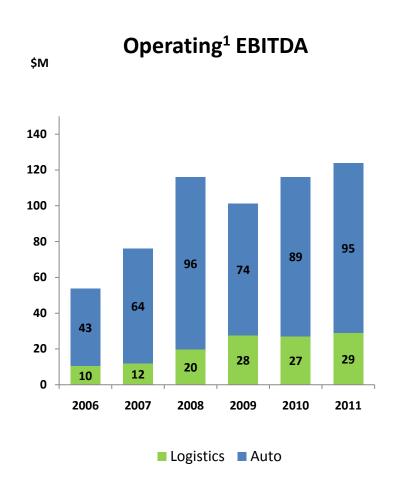
- Revenue increase 106.5%

Benefits of dual revenue streams



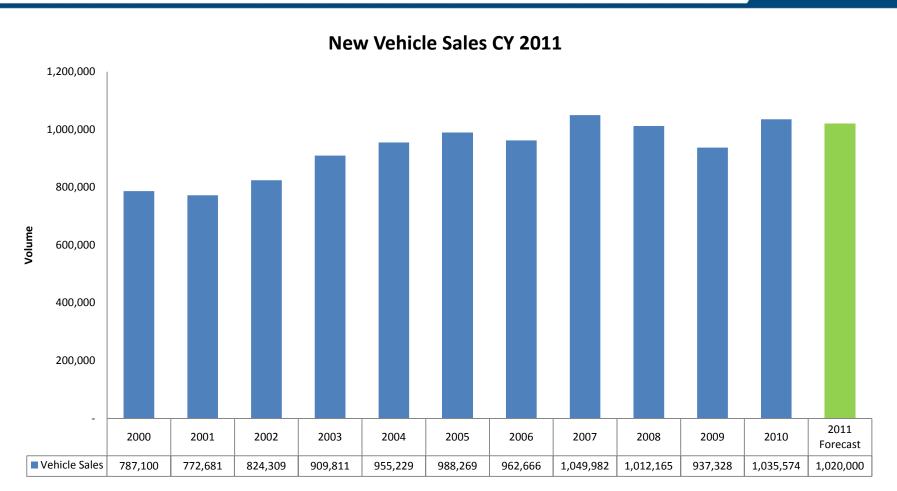

Growth opportunities in Automotive



- Strong Balance Sheet provides capacity for further acquisitions
- Strong relationships with manufacturers
- Focused on expanding Eastern States' operations, in particular Victoria
- Commenced development of Castle Hill Greenfield site
 - Hyundai commenced trading from temporary facilities in May 2011
 - Holden to commence trading from temporary facilities
 January 2012
- Acquisition of Diesel Motors Trucks

Growth opportunities – Castle Hill



- Two new dealerships Holden (April 2012) and Hyundai (July 2012)
- Two further dealerships planned for the site, expected completion CY13



Growth opportunities – Diesel Motors Trucks



- Acquired Diesel Motors Trucks
- Consolidation of Daimler Group truck brands –
 Mercedes Benz, Freightliner and Fuso
- AHG grows its position in the truck market
- Potential opportunity to consolidate truck dealership sites







Growth opportunities for Logistics

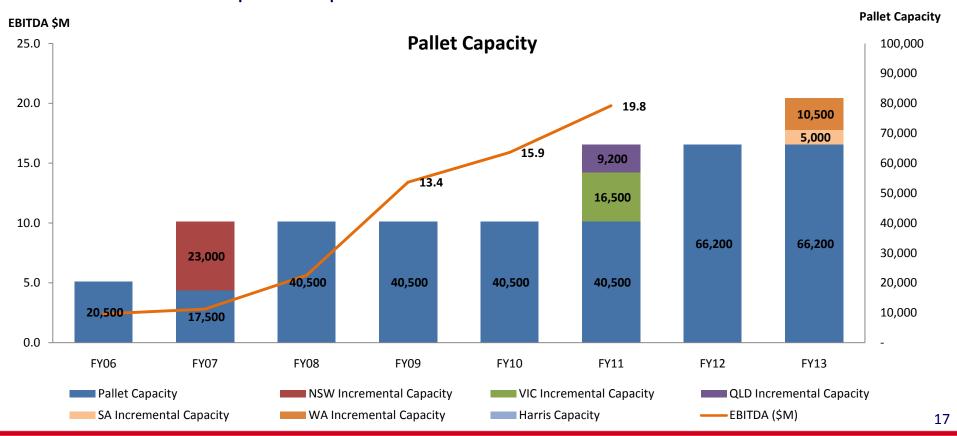


- New cold storage facilities planned for Refrigerated
