Issue of Shortfall Shares via Underwriting Agreement Additional \$2.78m Raised

Admiralty Resources NL (ASX: ADY) ("Admiralty" or "the Company") is pleased to announce that it has concluded the issue of shares pursuant to the Underwriting Agreement with Sino Investment & Holding Pty Ltd ("Sino Investment").

Admiralty has approved the appointment of several sub-underwriters nominated by Sino Investment. As a result, the Company will be issuing the maximum Shortfall Shares, being 61,888,286 shares at 4.5c, and raising \$2,784,973 via the Underwriting Agreement.

As a result of the Underwriting Agreement, Rights Offer and Shortfall Offer, Admiralty has raised a total of \$5,458,670 via the issue of 121,303,793 shares at 4.5c.

The Company now has 727,822,759 fully paid ordinary shares on issue.

Attached is an Appendix 3B – Application for quotation of additional securities, updated top 20 shareholders and distribution schedule.

Admiralty Resources NL is a public diversified mineral exploration company listed in the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX: ADY) with mineral interests in Chile and in Australia.

Admiralty's flagship projects are the iron ore districts in Chile: Harper South (2,498 Ha) and Pampa Tololo (3,455 Ha) and Leo Sur (600 Ha).

The districts are located in prime locations, with close and easy access to the Panamerican Highway (a major route), a railway line and operating shipping ports.

Admiralty's projects in Australia are the Bulman project, a zinc and lead prospect located in the Northern Territory and the Pyke Hill project, a cobalt and lead project in which Admiralty owns 50% of the mining lease.
