Waddikee Project farm-in agreement update

HIGHLIGHTS

- OM Manganese withdraws from farm-in agreement for manganese and iron at Monax's Waddikee Project in South Australia.
- Monax maintains 100% ownership of Waddikee Project.
- Withdrawal provides Monax with significant opportunity to progress potential iron and graphite mineralisation.




Figure 1. Location of the Waddikee Project, central Eyre Peninsula.

Monax Mining Limited (ASX: MOX) has received formal notification from OM Manganese (OMM), a wholly owned subsidiary of OM Holdings (ASX:OMH), of its withdrawal from a farm-in agreement with Monax for manganese and iron on the Waddikee Project in South Australia (Figure 1).

OMM did not earn any interest in the tenement, which remains wholly-owned by Monax.

The withdrawal provides Monax with significant exploration opportunity for potential iron mineralisation, as well as the Company's new focus on graphite at the site.

"Monax thanks OMM for its support in the search for manganese, and is grateful for the database generated by this search on the Waddikee Project," Monax Managing Director Mr Gary Ferris said.

"We believe the Waddikee tenement has significant potential for graphite and iron, and this will be the focus of future exploration at Waddikee in the near future," he said.
