This half-year report is presented under listing rule 4.2A and should be read in conjunction with the Company's 2012 Annual Report.

RESULTS FOR ANNOUNCEMENT TO THE MARKET

The reporting period is the half-year ended 31 December 2012 with the previous corresponding period being the half-year ended 31 December 2011.

Results for announcement to the market

- Profit for the half-year was \$4.5 million, down 9.2% from the previous corresponding period.
 This figure includes gains for the half-year on puttable instruments in the investment portfolio and unrealised losses on open options positions.
- Net Operating Result for the half-year before these gains on investments was \$3.4 million, up 13.0% from \$3.0 million in the previous corresponding period.
- Revenue from investments was \$3.8 million, down 6.1% from \$4.0 million in the previous corresponding period.
- As a result of realised gains during the period, the Company has now recouped all of the capital gains tax losses that were carried forward at the time of the recapitalisation in January 2004.
- Net tangible asset backing per share before any provision for tax on unrealised gains at 31 December 2012 was 83 cents per share, up from 74 cents at the end of the previous corresponding period.
- A final dividend of 2.5 cents per share (fully franked) in respect of the financial year ended 30 June 2012 was paid on 28 August 2012.
- In line with the Company's previous practice, no interim dividend has been declared in respect of the half-year ended 31 December 2012.



MEDIA RELEASE – HALF-YEAR RESULT TO 31 DECEMBER 2012

The Australian equity market over the six months to 31 December 2012 delivered strong returns, dominated by the defensive and large cap sectors of the market, particularly high yielding equities.

AMCIL is a medium to long term investor with a small concentrated portfolio of Australian equities. AMCIL's portfolio delivered a return of 11.7% over the six months whereas the S&P/ASX 200 Accumulation Index return was 16.4%. The 5 year return of the portfolio to 31 December 2012, which corresponds with AMCIL's investment time frame, was positive 4.8% per annum whereas the Index return was negative 1.6% per annum.

Profit for the half-year was \$4.5 million, down on last year's result of \$4.9 million. This decline was primarily due to movements in the valuation of Hastings Diversified Utilities Fund. The Net Operating Result, which represents the income generated from the investment and trading portfolios, was \$3.4 million versus \$3.0 million last year. The key reason for this increase was the positive contribution of \$0.2 million from the trading portfolio versus the negative contribution last half-year of \$0.5 million.

In line with the Company's current practice the Board has not declared an interim dividend.

The largest transaction in the portfolio was the sale of Hastings Diversified Utilities Fund whilst it was under takeover from the APA Group. As a result of this and other sales since the recapitalisation of the Company in January 2004, AMCIL has now recouped all of the capital gains tax losses that were carried forward at the time. From now on, unless new realised capital losses are incurred, any realised capital gains will be subject to tax. This would create franking credits which will be available for distribution to shareholders.

Major acquisitions for the six months were in Santos and Computershare, both new holdings in the portfolio, Oil Search, QBE Insurance, and National Australia Bank. Major sales also included Origin Energy, Senex Energy and Westpac.

AMCIL has some cash available to invest, although at this point a patient approach is appropriate given the solid rise in the market that has occurred over the half-year and against the background of expected weakness of the earnings outlook in the upcoming reporting season.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

This report in relation to the half-year to 31 December 2012 is presented by the Directors of AMCIL Limited ('the Company') in accordance with a resolution of Directors.

Company operations and results

Overview

Since 2003, the Company has been a thematic investor primarily in securities listed on the Australian Securities Exchange.

Performance Indicators and Outcomes

Profit for the half-year, which includes unrealised gains or losses from open options positions and the gain for the half-year on puttable instruments in the investment portfolio was \$4.5 million, down 9.2% from the previous corresponding period. The net operating result for the half-year, which excludes gains during the period on the company's investment in Hastings Diversified Utilities Fund, was \$3.4 million for the six months ended 31 December 2012, up from \$3.0 million last year, an increase of 13.0%. The primary reason for the increase was the positive contribution of \$0.2 million from the trading portfolio versus the negative contribution last year of \$0.5 million. The net operating result for the six months was equivalent to 1.63 cents per share.

As a result of sales during the period, AMCIL has now recouped all of the capital gains tax losses that were carried forward from the recapitalisation in January 2004. The value of all realised gains, after tax, will now be transferred to the Realised Capital Gains Tax Reserve, out of which dividends may be paid at the discretion of the Board.

A key component of earnings was distributions from the companies in which we invest of \$3.6 million. Of this amount, \$2.7 million was from the receipt of fully franked dividends.

The portfolio return for the six months to December 2012 delivered a positive return of 11.7% compared to the broader S&P/ASX200 return of 16.4%. AMCIL's portfolio return is after costs and tax paid (including tax on realised capital gains which can be returned to shareholders via franking credits).

The Board has decided not to declare an interim dividend.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Half-Year ended 31 December 2012

1. Basis of preparation of half-year financial report

This general purpose half-year financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

This interim financial report does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report. This report should be read in conjunction with the 2012 Annual Report and public announcements made by the Company during the half-year, in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The Company has attempted to improve the transparency of its reporting by adopting 'plain English' where possible. Key 'plain English' phrases and their equivalent AASB terminology are as follows:

2. Financial reporting by segments

The Company operates as a Listed Investment Company in Australia. It has no reportable business or geographic segments.

(a) Segment information provided to the Board

The internal reporting provided to the Board for the Company's assets, liabilities and performance is prepared on a consistent basis with the measurement and recognition principles of Australian Accounting Standards, except that net assets are reviewed both before and after the effects of capital gains tax on investments (as reported in the Company's Net Tangible Asset announcements to the ASX).

The Board considers the Company's Net Operating Result after tax to be a key measure of the Company's performance. This amount excludes the impact of unrealised gains or losses on open options and any gains or losses on the Company's investment portfolio and reconciles to the Company's profit before tax as follows:

(b) Other segment information

(i) Segment Revenue

Revenues from external parties are derived from the receipt of dividend, distribution and interest income, and income arising on the trading portfolio and realised income from the options portfolio.

The Company is domiciled in Australia and the Company's income is derived predominantly from Australian entities or entities that have a listing on the Australian Securities Exchange. The Company has a diversified portfolio of investments, with only investments comprising more than 10% of the Company's income, including contribution from the trading portfolio and realised income from the options written portfolio – Commonwealth Bank of Australia: 11.3% and ANZ Bank: 10.6% (2011: None)

3. Trading portfolio

The Company enters into option contracts in the trading portfolio for the purpose of enhancing returns, offsetting risk or providing opportunities to acquire or sell securities at advantageous prices.

As at balance date there were no call options outstanding (30 June 2012: \$Nil).

4. Current liabilities – options written portfolio

As at balance date there were call options outstanding which potentially required the Company, if they were exercised, to deliver securities to the value of \$1.4 million (30 June 2012: \$Nil).

5. Deferred tax liabilities – investment portfolio

At balance date, the Company had no unused losses on the sale of investments available to setoff against future capital gains (30 June 2012: \$3.4 million). During the half-year, \$3.4 million of gains were set off against brought-forward losses, fully utilising the remaining balance.

In accordance with AASB 112 *Income Taxes*, deferred tax liabilities have been recognised for Capital Gains Tax on the unrealised gains in the investment portfolio at current tax rates (30%) totalling \$9.5 million (30 June 2012 : \$6.3 million). As the Directors do not intend to dispose of the portfolio, this tax liability may not be crystallised at this amount.

Independent auditor's review report to the members of AMCIL Limited

Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

We have reviewed the accompanying half-year financial report of AMCIL Limited, which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 December 2012, and the income statement, the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the half-year ended on that date, selected explanatory notes and the directors' declaration for AMCIL Limited (the company).

Directors' responsibility for the half-year financial report

The directors of the company are responsible for the preparation of the half-year financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the *Corporations Act 2001* and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the half-year financial report that is free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the half-year financial report based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410 Review of a Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the financial report is not in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 including: giving a true and fair view of the company's financial position as at 31 December 2012 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001. As the auditor of AMCIL Limited, ASRE 2410 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.

A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our review, we have complied with the independence requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

Based on our review, which is not an audit, we have not become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report of AMCIL Limited is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* including:

- (b) complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001.
