Principal Activities

The principal activities of the consolidated entity during the financial half-year are the design, manufacture and support of high speed aluminium ships and systems for the defence, paramilitary and civil markets. These activities are unchanged from the previous year.

Results

The profit of the consolidated entity for the half-year was \$5.390 million after income tax.

Review of Operations

The Group operating profit before tax for the first half period was \$7.829 million compared with the result for the corresponding prior half period loss of \$6.325 million. Revenue increased by \$116.936 million over the corresponding prior half year period to \$384.367 million. EBITDA for the period to 31 December 2012 was \$24.002 million compared to the previous corresponding half year of \$2.708 million.

Revenue in the USA operations increased by \$96.472 million compared with the corresponding prior half year period to \$323.378 million. The growth is attributable to increased activity in Austal's USA operations, which has three Joint High Speed Vessels (JHSV) and three Littoral Combat Ships (LCS) under construction. This includes USNS "Spearhead" (JHSV 1) which was delivered in December 2013. As is common with new, complex naval vessel designs, first of class effects adversely impacted productivity resulting in the vessel being substantially over budget. With the design now mature and lessons learned from the first vessel being successfully applied, productivity on subsequent hulls has improved, resulting in improved profitability. The segment profit before interest and tax as a percentage of revenue for the period was 5.16% compared with 1.15% for the corresponding period the previous year. During the period, the US Navy exercised their option for the last vessel under the JHSV contract and Austal USA now has confirmed orders for ten JHSVs and five LCSs. Contract options for six LCSs are still to be exercised.

Revenue in the Henderson Shipyard operations increased by 43% over the corresponding prior half year period to \$46.532 million, but revenue levels are low reflecting continued softness in the market for large commercial vessels as a result of challenging global economic conditions and the sustained strength of the Australian dollar. Work was mainly on the \$330 million contract for the design, construction and through-life support of eight Cape Class patrol boats for the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service. The Cape Class project provides construction work through to the second half of 2015, and support work through to August 2019. It is a key first step in the repositioning of Austal's Henderson facilities as a defence focused operation.

During the period, property at Henderson was sold generating profit on sale of \$4.830 million.

The Philippines Shipyard completed its first vessel in December 2012 for delivery in January 2013. Construction is in progress for an 80 metre vehicle ferry for delivery in September 2013 and three windfarm vessels for delivery in 2014. The operation generated a profit before interest and tax for the period of \$0.725 million.

In the Service sector, Austal continued to provide its support offerings worldwide from Service Centres in Australia; Oman; Spain; Trinidad and Tobago and the United States. The charter of high speed vessel "WestPac Express" chartered with the United States Navy's Military Sealift Command was extended for a further 6 months to August 2013. During the period the company acquired an engineering business in Darwin to expand its operation in the region.

In December 2012, the motor yacht built in 2009 was sold at a discounted price due to depressed market conditions. The net after tax impact was a loss of \$3.08 million.

Additional capital raised during the period of \$75.846 million was applied to reduce borrowings and to restricted cash deposits to securitize the Go Zone borrowings in the USA. \$3.499 million equity was issued as part of the payment for the Darwin engineering business.

1 CORPORATE INFORMATION

The half-year financial report of Austal Limited (the Company) for the period ended 31 December 2012 was authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 21 February 2013.

Austal Limited is a company limited by shares incorporated and domiciled in Australia whose shares are publicly traded on the Australian stock exchange.

2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The half-year financial report is a general purpose condensed financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 and AASB 134 "Interim Financial Reporting".

The half-year financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the consolidated entity as the full financial report.

The half-year financial report should be read in conjunction with the annual Financial Report of Austal Limited as at 30 June 2012.

It is also recommended that the half-year financial report be considered together with any public announcements made by Austal Limited and its controlled entities during the half-year ended 31 December 2012 in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations arising under the Corporations Act 2001 and Australian Stock Exchange Listing Rules.

(b) Significant accounting policies

The half-year consolidated financial statements have been prepared using the same accounting policies as used in the annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2012.

Since 1 July 2012 the Group has adopted all the Standards and Interpretations mandatory for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 July 2012. Adoption of these Standards and Interpretations did not have any effect on the financial position or performance of the Group. The Group has not elected to early adopt any new standards or interpretations that are not mandatorily effective.

5. SEGMENT REPORTING

Identification of reportable segments

For management purposes the group is organised into four business segments based on the location of the production facilities, related sales regions and types of activity.

The Chief Executive Officer monitors the performance of the business segments separately for the purpose of making decisions about resources to be allocated and of assessing performance. Segment performance is evaluated based on operating profit or loss. Finance costs, finance income and income tax are managed on a group basis.

The Group's reportable segments are as follows:

USA

The USA manufactures high performance aluminium defence vessels for the U.S Navy.

Henderson Ship Yard Operations ("HSO")

The HSO business manufactures high performance aluminium defence vessels for navys and border protection agencies for markets worldwide, excluding the USA.

Service & Systems

The Service business provides training and on-going support and maintenance for high performance vessels and includes the chartering of a vessel to the US Navy Military Sealift Command.

Philippines Shipyard Operations ("PSO")

The PSO business manufactures high performance aluminium commercial vessels for markets worldwide, excluding the USA.

Other/Unallocated

The following items and associated assets and liabilities are not allocated to operating segments as they are not considered part of the core operations of any segment:

- Cost of group services
- Corporate overheads
- Revenue from property leased to other group segments
- Finance revenue and costs
- Taxation
- Assets held for sale
- Derivatives
- Commercial vessel bareboat charter contracts

Accounting policies and inter-segment transactions

The accounting policies used by the Group in reporting segments internally are the same as those in the prior period.

Inter-entity sales are recognised based on an arm's length pricing structure.

8. BUSINESS COMBINATION

On 4 October 2012, Austal Service Darwin Pty Ltd acquired 100% of the ordinary shares in KM Engineering (NT) Pty Ltd ("KME") and Hydraulink (NT) Pty Ltd ("Hydraulink") and the sellers of KME and Hydraulink obtained a 20% share of Austal Service Darwin Pty Ltd.

KME & Hydraulink are private companies operating in the Northern Territory and provide engineering and hydraulic services to the Royal Australian Navy (RAN) and Australian Customs and Border Protection Service.

The Group has provisionally recognised the fair values of the identifiable assets and liabilities of KME & Hydraulink based on the best information available as of the reporting date. The transaction is not considered material.
