In addition, Virtus has pursued a strategy of capturing related business revenues, and now provides specialised diagnostic services and day hospital services to support its network of fertility clinics.

Since establishment, Virtus has made a number of acquisitions including Hunter IVF (March 2011) and Gold Coast Fertility (July 2011).
