Change of roles

A new General Manager, Exploration has been appointed at New Zealand Oil & Gas.

Dr William Houston was previously Geoscience Manager and most recently Acting Exploration Manager. He will join the senior management team.

Dr Houston has spent the past fifteen years in exploration, development and new ventures. He worked in onshore U.S. conventional and unconventional exploration and also raising private equity for exploration and development projects. In 2010 he was an offshore senior geologist with PTTEP in Bangkok, Thailand. He joined New Zealand Oil & Gas in 2011.

From 2009 to 2011 he served on the executive committee of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, an international professional society with 35,000 members. He is an AAPG Certified Petroleum Geologist with a PhD in Geology from Michigan Technological University.

"I am very pleased to have Bill's expertise used in this new role. He will contribute strongly to the company's future success as we continue to build our portfolio," New Zealand Oil & Gas Chief Executive Andrew Knight said.

Dr Houston's appointment follows Dr Mac Beggs' move to a new role in the company identifying long term opportunities to discover oil and gas.
