


# **Quarterly Report**

For the three months ending 31 December 2014

### **Summary & Highlights for the Quarter**

- End of quarter cash position was \$0.84M;
- Negotiations for the divestment of the Collurabbie project to a particular party were terminated. The Company will now recommence its search for a JV partner.
- No field work was completed on the Company's 100% owned Collurabbie, Saxby or Cloncurry Projects. The managers of the Deleta JV and Windanning JV have not reported any field activities.
- The Company continued to review joint venture / acquisition opportunities as well as maintain its project generation strategy.
- Voluntary reduction of remuneration for Board and Managing Director.

### **Mineral Exploration Activities**

As for the previous quarters, the Company continued to review a number of mineral exploration properties as part of its ongoing commitment to find an asset that can add value to the company's portfolio. Several local and international opportunities have been reviewed, but so far none have satisfied the company's present criteria given its financial capacity, their development potential and the expected level of market interest.

#### Collurabbie Project, Duketon Belt, Yilgarn Block WA (100% Falcon, seeking JV partner)

The Collurabbie Project is 200 km north of Laverton in the Duketon Greenstone Belt of Western Australia. Falcon and / or its former JV partners have been exploring the project area for more than a decade and have completed airborne and ground geophysical surveys, surface geochemical surveys and a high volume of drilling. The project includes the Olympia nickel-copper discovery and several other nickel and gold prospects and targets.

<u>Divestment Strategy</u> – Unfortunately, the advance joint venture negotiations with a particular party did not reached a resolution; and as a consequence these negotiations have now been terminated. The Company will recommence it search for a suitable joint venture party.

No field work was undertaken on the project this quarter. Tenement administration included a 40% compulsory reduction for E38/2009 and the surrender of a small prospecting licence (P38/3876) considered to have no strategic value.

#### Saxby Project, Mt Isa Block QLD (100% Falcon, seeking JV partner)

The Saxby Project consists of one exploration permit located 165 km north-northeast of Cloncurry in the Gulf Country of northwest Queensland. EPM 15398 contains precious and base metal prospects (including the Lucky Squid Gold and Tea Tree Nickel prospects). These prospects are hosted by basement rocks of the Mt Isa Block that are buried beneath 400m of younger sedimentary cover.

During the quarter there were no field activities undertaken. EPM 25152 was surrendered as part of on-going tenement management. The Saxby Project now consists of EPM 15398 that contains the Lucky Squid gold and the Tea Tree nickel prospects.

#### Cloncurry Project, Mt Isa Block QLD (100% Falcon)

The Cloncurry Project consists of two Exploration Permits for Minerals (**EPM**). EPM 18289 is located 10km northeast of Cloncurry and 20km southwest of the Ernest Henry Cu-Au mine. EPM 18313 is located 85km south of Cloncurry.

Falcon considers the ground to be prospective for Cu-Au mineralisation and is reviewing the results of Minotaur Exploration's historical work to determine the next step in mineral exploration. Minotaur completed geophysical surveys and ground mapping under the Cloncurry Joint Venture Agreement with Falcon. Minotaur withdrew from the joint venture at the start of the quarter.

#### Deleta Joint Venture, Duketon Greenstone Belt WA (20% Falcon)

Regis Resources Limited is the operator and manager of the JV which began in September 1998. The JV consists of three mining titles. E38/1939 is immediately south of Falcon's Collurabbie Project whilst E38/2005 and M38/1091 are immediately north of Regis's Moolart Well gold mine. Falcon retains a 20% free carried interest to completion of feasibility study.

No field activities were reported by the JV manager.

#### Windanning Hill JV, Yalgoo Greenstone Belt WA (Falcon diluting; ~19% retained interest)

The Windanning Hill Project is 75km southeast of Yalgoo. It consists of two Mining Leases (M59/379 and M59/380) under JV to Minjar Gold Pty Ltd. It includes the Keronima gold prospect.

No field activities were reported by the JV manager.

### **Corporate**

The Annual General Meeting of shareholders was held at the office of Calder Roth & Co on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2014. All resolutions were passed.

There were no changes to the capital structure of the Company and the cash reserves at the end of quarter were \$0.84M. During the quarter \$17,000 was spent on exploration activities.

The Board has agreed to further reduce their remuneration as part of on-going cost savings. The Chairman and Non-Executive Director have reduced their annual fees to \$10,000 and the Managing Director has agreed to an annual remuneration of \$80,000. These fees take effect from 1 January 2015.

The mining tenements held at the end of the quarter and their location is listed in Table 1.
