SubPartners INDIGO Project update

Superloop Limited (ASX: SLC) is pleased to announce that significant progress has been made on the construction of the INDIGO submarine cable connecting Singapore, Jakarta, Perth and Sydney.

Seaward Duct almost complete

Superloop subsidiary SubPartners and its contractor have completed the horizontal directional drilling phase of its seaward facing bore pipe project at Coogee beach Sydney. The newly constructed 1,900 metre long bore-hole facilitates the landing of two subsea telecommunication cables including the INDIGO cable system.

With the directional drilling phase completed, steel casing pipes will be inserted within the newly created bore-hole during the next week to provide protection for the submarine cable. This will mark the completion of the seaward duct in readiness for the INDIGO Central cable which is currently scheduled to be installed mid 2018.

Marine survey 70% complete

The INDIGO subsea cable project marine survey is well underway and is 70% complete. Remaining marine survey activities are for the INDIGO West cable path running south between Jakarta and Perth. These are due for completion before the end of November, at which time the marine survey will be 100% complete.

Manufacturing of the INDIGO Subsea Cable and Repeaters has commenced

Manufacturing of the INDIGO subsea repeaters and cable has commenced at the system supplier factory locations in London and Paris. Over the next six months over 9,000 kms of cable and 110 repeaters will be manufactured and ready for shipping by May 2018.

The completion of INDIGO subsea cable project is on track and scheduled for H1 2019.

The Company has constructed TKO Express, the first submarine cable to connect the traditional carrier hotels located in Chai Wan on Hong Kong Island and the data centre campus located at Hong Kong Science and Technology Park's Tseung Kwan O Industrial Estate on the mainland, providing much needed physical diversity and a low latency path between Hong Kong's major finance and technology hubs. TKO Express is the world's largest fibre core count subsea cable system.

The Group also operates businesses including BigAir Group, NuSkope and SubPartners.

BigAir Group provides a diverse range of ICT services to small-to-medium enterprises, government, retail, mining and education customers across Australia. It offers network infrastructure, Cloud-based solutions and managed services, including communications and WiFi into student campuses. BigAir owns an advanced, large-scale fixed wireless broadband network, including more than 300 wireless PoPs, delivering business-grade services at speeds up to 1Gbps. The BigAir Group includes CyberHound, a provider of Internet security solutions to primary and secondary schools.

Submarine cable infrastructure provider, SubPartners, will expand Superloop's trans-Australian and international capacity, giving the Company ownership of international submarine cable capacity as a member of the INDIGO consortium which is constructing the INDIGO West cable system (Singapore to Perth) and the INDIGO Central cable system (Perth to Sydney).
