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FOD signs \$8 million agreement with ICC Global

The Food Revolution Group Limited (ASX: FOD) is pleased to announce it has signed an agreement with ICC Global Pty Ltd which will see ICC Global order \$8 million of FOD products by the end of 2020.

ICC Global, which also trades as Australian International Cross-Border E-Commerce, is an international cross-border e-commerce platform that connects Australian manufacturers with Daigou (personal exporters) and other emerging sales channels in China and other international markets.

Under the MOU, ICC will order at least \$8 million in FOD products by 31 December 2020. This will include products from FOD's existing range, and any future products added to its portfolio. ICC Global is particularly interested in FOD's upcoming range of sachet and gel products — which will contain marine proteins and collagen (launching early in FY20).

ICC's first order will be a minimum of 10,000 units of FOD's orange juice in one-litre and two-litre sizes. FOD will ship the order to Shanghai in June 2019.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will see FOD and ICC agree on establishing a long-term strategic cooperative business relationship with ICC to become an important distribution partner for FOD.

FOD Executive Chairman Dr Norman Li said signing the MOU was an important step for FOD in further growing its distribution channels in China and internationally.

"This agreement for ICC Global to order \$8 million will help FOD further grow awareness of its brands in China. We had a very successful diagou visit to the factory with the distributors very impressed with our facility, brands and capabilities. I believe further distribution deals will be forthcoming. The diagous were very impressed to see our orange juice being produced in real time, the citrus oil that can be produced from the peel (waste product) and our upcoming sachet products and these new products could potentially be a large growth driver for the Company going forward," he said.

"ICC's first order of 10,000 units of our orange juice is just the start of our long term relationship and we look forward to further building our sales and distribution relationship with ICC over the next few years."

FOD has China Inspection and Quarantine (CIQ) certification for its Fruit Farm juices and is already shipping orange and apple juice to China as part of a deal with strategic partner JJ Global Fine Foods. Updates on initial orders of Canola oil to Sinopec are also expected in the not too distant future.

Daigou site visit

As part of signing the MOU with ICC Global, FOD hosted 70 daigous at its Mill Park operations in Melbourne. The group received an overview of FOD's business and sampled FOD products ahead of the two companies officially signing the MOU.
