UPDATE ON HARVEST

Murray River Organics Group Limited (ASX: MRG) ("**Company**" or "**MRG**"), which owns 11 farms across the Sunraysia region producing dried vine fruit, fresh table grapes and citrus, having now completed a pre harvest vineyard assessment provides the following update on its viticulture assets.

Crop and Harvest

The Sunraysia region experienced extreme and sustained hot weather conditions over the summer period with prolonged periods of temperatures above 40 degrees Celsius. These challenging conditions have had a negative impact on viticulture production on some of MRG's farms, with some damage evident mainly on berries directly exposed to the sun. Since this heat event the district has experienced cooler conditions that has reduced further potential damage to MRG's vines.

The crop potential for future years is not impacted by what is principally berry damage this harvest.

Improved vine nutrition and irrigation practices implemented earlier this season have delivered increased canopy and cane growth which means that MRG's vineyards are better placed for an improved crop in the 2021 growing season.

MRG recently held its grower forum in Mildura attended by growers, Dried Fruit Australia (DFA) CEO and Board members as well as DFA Chair, Mr Mark King, who addressed the group advising that many other dried vine growers in the region had also been significantly impacted by the weather.

MRG's table grape property at Fifth Street experienced minimal impact with harvest commenced in early January.

There is no change to FY20 guidance.
