1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2020 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Director's report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2020."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3. RESOLUTION 2 - RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR - MR TIM GRICE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 13.2 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Mr Tim Grice, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director."

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an **Ordinary Resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 327B(1) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, BDO Audit Pty Ltd ACN 134 022 870, having been nominated by shareholders and consented in writing to act as auditor of the Company, be appointed as auditor of the Company, effective immediately."

Voting by proxy

If you do not bring your Proxy Form with you, you can still attend the meeting but representatives from Advanced Share Registry Services will need to verify your identity. EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2020 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.stemify.com.au.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

2.4 Board recommendation

Noting that each Director has a personal interest in their own remuneration (as described in the remuneration report), each Director recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR TIMOTHY GRICE

3.1 General

The Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

Timothy Grice, who has served as a Director since 16 December 2016 and was last re-elected on 30 November 2018, retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Grice is an experienced business advisor and capital markets professional with over 30 years' experience. He has held a number of senior advisor positions at national and international stockbroking firms and been involved in raising capital for many emerging companies in technology, biotechnology and resources.

3.3 Independence

If re-elected the Board considers Timothy Grice will be an independent Director.

3.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Mr Grice's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that Mr Grice's skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board (with Mr Grice abstaining) supports the re-election of Mr Grice and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

On 10 January 2020, pursuant to section 327C(1) of the Corporations Act, BDO Audit Pty Ltd was appointed as auditor of the Company to fulfil a casual vacancy. The appointment followed the resignation of BDO East Coast Partnership and ASIC's consent to the resignation in accordance with section 329(5) of the Corporations Act.

Under section 327C(2) of the Corporations Act, an auditor who has been appointed under section 327C(1) of the Corporations Act only holds office until the company's next annual general meeting.

The Company is required to appoint an auditor to fill any vacancy at each annual general meeting (after its first annual general meeting) pursuant to section 327B(1) of the Corporations Act.

Pursuant to section 328B of the Corporations Act, the Company received a valid notice of nomination which nominated BDO Audit Pty Ltd to be appointed as the new auditor of the Company. A copy of the notice of nomination is set out in Schedule 1 of this Notice of Meeting.

BDO Audit Pty Ltd has provided the Company its written consent to act, subject to Shareholder approval being obtained, as the Company's auditor in accordance with section 328A(1) of the Corporations Act.

Accordingly, under this Resolution 3, Shareholder approval is being sought to appoint BDO Audit Pty Ltd as the auditor of the Company.

Directors' recommendation

The Board of Directors recommend that Shareholders vote for this Resolution.
