Quarterly Activity Report: July – September 2022

Highlights:

- **\$8.2M revenue generated for Q1 FY23**
- **Cash flow breakeven, despite difficult trading conditions**
- **\$2M+ cash on hand**
- **Successfully reduced inventory by 22% (from Q4 FY22) to \$7.6M**
- **Expansion across new marketplace platforms, Woolworths Everyday Market, Bunnings and Mosaic Brands**

Pure-Play online retailer Harris Technology Group Limited (ASX: HT8) is pleased to provide its activity report for the September FY23 quarter.

Operations Update

For the September quarter, Harris Technology generated sales revenue of \$8.2M and operating cash flow was breakeven as a result of continued focus on inventory quality. By reducing exposure to underperforming brands, sales revenue has declined but with improved margins.

Added to the focus on optimising margin mix, trading conditions have been soft resulting in a decrease in the technology category mitigated by increasing household category sales where demand has been less impacted by macroeconomic cost-of-living increases and margins are significantly higher.

On 30 September 2022, inventory on hand was \$7.6M (\$9.8M – 30/6/22) representing a 22% decrease. The decrease was achieved by clearance of ageing tech inventory such as high-end graphic cards. The Board is pleased with the current level which enables the company to invest in summer seasonal and Christmas inventory heading into the retail events and holiday season.

With a strong presence on Amazon and eBay as well as all major Australian online marketplace platforms, Harris Technology continues to expand its digital footprint. The company's products are now also available on Woolworths' Everyday Market, Bunnings Marketplace, and Mosaic Brands (which contains 11 consumer websites).

Harris Technology CEO, Garrison Huang commented, "Despite tough economic conditions, it is pleasing that we have reduced our inventory holding and conserved cash. Our strategy of elimination of low-margin tech products has had a short-term impact on revenue but in turn will set the company on a long-term profitability path. Investing in the household category puts Harris Technology in a position to benefit from the upcoming retail season where these popular home products are historically at peak demand. We look forward to reporting positive sales in the December quarter."
