Biosecurity update

Inghams Group Limited (ASX: ING) (Inghams, Company) notes recent media reports relating to the detection of the Avian Influenza (AI) virus at a layer egg (table egg) farm in Northern Victoria.

Inghams has no commercial broiler farms located in the affected region. As a result, there is currently no impact to Inghams operations or its supply chain, and the Company will continue to supply the market as usual.

The outbreak is being managed by Agriculture Victoria in line with the procedures implemented in the 2024 Al outbreak in South-West Victoria.

Agriculture Victoria has advised that testing by the Australian Centre for Disease Preparedness has confirmed the strain H7N8, which is different to the strain that impacted Victorian farms in 2024, while it is the same strain found in New South Wales/Australian Capital Territory in 2024.

Inghams has implemented enhanced biosecurity measures across its Victorian operations as a precautionary measure, which are in addition to its already strict standard protocols. These measures include restricting access to all Victorian operations (livestock and processing). Based on the location of the infected facility, there is no risk to Inghams operations.
