Acusensus awarded new \$8.7m five-year agreement for Western Australia fixed camera program

Highlights

- New five-plus year contract signed with the WA Road Safety Commission to supply multi-function fixed site enforcement camera programs
- The program will see fixed safety camera technology deployed at selected freeway locations to detect a range of road traffic offences, including average speeding, mobile phone use, improper seatbelt use, speeding, "red X" lane violations and unlicensed vehicles
- Estimated initial contract value of \$8.7 million (excluding GST) over the initial five-year term
- The new fixed camera program is in addition to the \$9.4 million (excluding GST) trailer-based enforcement contract announced in October 2024
- This second significant contract in Western Australia further emphasises Acusensus' position as a provider of advanced multi-function enforcement technology in the State

Acusensus Limited (ASX:ACE) (Acusensus), a technology company designing and developing artificial intelligence enabled road safety solutions, is pleased to announce that its wholly owned subsidiary, Acusensus Australia Pty Ltd, has signed a new agreement with the Western Australian government, acting through the Road Safety Commission unit of the Western Australian Police Force (**WA Road Safety Commission**) for a multi-function fixed safety camera program. This new agreement, awarded after a competitive tender process, follows on from a trial agreement that commenced operations in January 2022.

This multi-function fixed safety camera program for sites on Western Australian freeways such as the Mitchell Freeway and the Kwinana Freeway is subject to terms and conditions appropriate for this program. It has an initial term of five years, with the WA Road Safety Commission having the option to extend the term on up to three occasions, each for a period of one year.

Acusensus Founder and Managing Director, Alexander Jannink, said:

"We are delighted to expand upon our partnership with the Western Australian government. The deployment of our multi-function fixed cameras on the Mitchell and Kwinana Freeways will significantly enhance the WA Road Safety Commission's ability to enforce key road safety behaviours.

Acusensus was first able to demonstrate its leading technological capabilities and attentive service to the WA Road Safety Commission through the initial pilot installation on the Kwinana freeway in 2022, and I am pleased to continue to deepen this relationship over time, expanding into this ongoing contract alongside the expansion into trailer enforcement announced in October last year.

Sadly 2025 has seen high road casualties on Western Australian roads, emphasising the need for the driver behaviour change that will come from our existing trailer-based enforcement contract (which recently commenced active enforcement), and from this new freeway enforcement program."

Acusensus' fixed site technology supplied under this new program has the ability to detect drivers who are using mobile phones whilst driving, front seat vehicle occupants who are not wearing seatbelts properly, as well as drivers who are speeding both at a point in time and on an average basis over a set distance, "red X" lane violations and unregistered vehicles.

The estimated contract value is \$8.7 million (excluding GST) over the initial five-year term. The existing sites operating under the trial program on the Kwinana Freeway will now roll commercially into this new agreement with new sites to be added to other freeway locations over the coming months.
