September 2025 Quarterly Activities Report and Update

ARC Funds Limited (ASX:ARC) ("ARC or "the Company"), is pleased to release its Appendix 4C Quarterly Cash Flow Report and summary of its activities for the quarter ending 30 September 2025.

Highlights

- \$634k Equity Placement @ 10 cents per share
- The Term Deposit Shop Final Completion Payment of \$230k

The September quarter was the first full period to include The Term Deposit Shop.

The revenue from core activities was \$154k in the quarter.

The net cash expenditure was \$347K, which included staff costs, legal, advisory, administrative expenses and investment expenditure included the final working capital adjustment payment of \$230k pertaining to the acquisition of The Term Deposit Shop(TTDS) transaction.

In the quarter the Company completed equity capital raises with the issue of 6.34million new shares raising a total of \$634k before costs to existing shareholders and new sophisticated investors.

The net cash movement was a positive \$369K in the quarter with the cash balance at end of the quarter of \$659K.

Payments to related parties, which are the Managing Director and Directors totalled \$134k which was primarily the salary of the Managing Director, the Non-Executive Directors fees and facilitation fees and interest on loans.

Term Deposit Shop (63.49% ARC Ownership)

The Term Deposit Shop (TTDS), an online cash investment platform, continues to perform in line with our expectations and remains profitable, supported by long term clients and recurring revenue.

Since the acquisition of our controlling interest in May 25, ARC management has taken over the day-to-day management of this business. Funds under administration remain steady at over \$500 million.

The demand for term deposits remains robust, with over \$1.2 Trillion in Bank Term Deposits in Australia, it is the objective of The Term Deposit Shop (TTDS) to significantly grow the funds on it's platform.

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Merewether Capital (72% ARC Ownership)

Merewether Capital continues to perform for its investors. As at 30 September 2025 the investment performance of the fund is summarised below.

MD & CEO Share Conversion

Following shareholder approval at the EGM held late September and post completion of the September quarter, Managing Director and CEO, Scott Beeton converted \$200,000 of short-term loans to the company into 2,000,000 new shares at 10 cents per share. The funding provides ARC with support as it pursues its growth ambitions and is reflective of Scott's support for the company, for which the Board is appreciative.

ARC is actively seeking investment opportunities to expand our existing portfolio of businesses. This includes acquiring strategic stakes in complimentary businesses. We are currently well progressed on examining a number of investment opportunities.
