EG ACQUISITION REVISED REMEDY TO ADDRESS COMPETITION CONCERNS

On 7 April 2026, Ampol lodged a revised remedy offer with the Australian Competition & Consumer Commission (ACCC) in connection with its proposed acquisition of EG Australia.

The revised remedy offer takes into account the Notice of Competition Concerns (NOCC) provided by the ACCC that set out its “preliminary assessment” of Ampol’s proposed acquisition of EG Australia. Since the NOCC was received on 2 March 2026, Ampol has provided further information to the ACCC and engaged extensively.

Having considered the matters raised in the NOCC and Ampol’s subsequent submissions to the ACCC, Ampol has revised its remedy offer to 37 sites, representing an increase of 18 sites to be divested alongside the initial 19 sites from the original remedy Ampol offered.

Ampol believes divesting these sites will fully address any remaining competition concerns the ACCC may hold. The ACCC will now undertake consultation on the remedy.

Additionally, Ampol has identified and materially progressed discussions with buyers for the sites proposed for divestment. Any buyer of divested sites will require ACCC approval, and the ACCC’s consultation process will include consideration of potential buyers.

The Phase 2 ACCC determination date is expected to be 5 June 2026, and the transaction is targeted for completion in mid-2026 subject to receiving ACCC clearance and completing other conditions precedent.
