1.1 – Receipts from product sales and related debtors in the nine month period to 31 March 2008 includes US\$17,228,550 from the sale of 250,000 pounds of third party uranium purchased in the quarter ending 30 June 2007 (no relevant receipts in current quarter).

1.2(d) – Payments for administration in the quarter to March 2008 are high compared to that for the nine month period to March 2008 due to bonus payments to employees for the year ended 31 December 2007, GST credit inflows received in the September 2007 quarter arising from the takeover of Summit Resources Ltd and the timing of payments.

1.5 – Interest and other costs of finance paid for the nine months to 31 March 2008 includes a US\$5.6 million bi-annual interest payment on the convertible bonds maturing 15 December 2011 (no relevant payments in current quarter).

1.23 – Includes a US\$535,000 bonus paid to the Managing Director for the year ended 31 December 2007.

- 3.3 US\$250m convertible bonds issued on 15 December 2006 with a coupon rate of 4.5% maturing 15 December 2011 at a conversion price of US\$7.685 per share.

- 3.4 US\$325m convertible bonds issued on 11 March 2008 with a coupon rate of 5.0% maturing 15 March 2013 at a conversion price of US\$6.59 per share.

- 3.5 Paladin has received credit committee approved offers of financing totalling US\$167m for the Kayelekera Uranium Project in Malawi, consisting of a seven year Project Finance Facility of US\$145m, a Standby Cost Overrun Facility of US\$12m and a Performance Bond Facility of US\$10m. The facilities are being provided by Société Générale Corporate and Investment Banking (as intercreditor agent and commercial lender), Nedbank Capital a division of Nedbank Limited (ECIC lender) and The Standard Bank of South Africa Ltd (as ECIC facility agent and lender). Drawdown on the financing is subject to completion of legal documentation and fulfilment of other conditions precedent usual for this type of funding, including approval for an export credit guarantee from The Export Credit Insurance Corporation (ECIC), South Africa's statutory export credit and foreign investment insurance provider.
